Murmushi People's Development Foundation (MPDF) is a dynamic, integrity-driven Nigerian non-governmental organization (NGO) with its headquarters in Jimeta-Yola and a branch office in Mubi North LGA, Adamawa State. While registered to work across the country, MPDF's current strongest operational footprint is in Adamawa State, where it has implemented a wide range of humanitarian and development initiatives across most Local Government Areas (LGAs) and all the 226 wards of the state. Since 2017, the organization has delivered impactful programs in peacebuilding, governance, health, nutrition, WASH, education, livelihoods, protection, and climate resilience, ranging from targeted community interventions in LGAs such as Mubi North, Mubi South, Michika, Hong, Gombi, Demsa, Yola South, Girie, Madagali, and Bole communities to large-scale, state-wide operations such as COVID-19 palliative distribution and the Murmushi Almajiri Support Initiative. With extensive local partnerships and a growing portfolio of impactful projects, MPDF stands out as a capable and reliable partner for transformative development in Nigeria.




